# Beyond Mass Shootings: The Hidden Epidemic of Gun Homicide Ron Pinciaro, Executive Director, CT Against Gun Violence

Participating in elections is the most effective way to become personally known to policy makers. This session will focus on how to help keep good legislators in office, and get involved in campaigns that will replace those who are not good on the issue. Participants will also learn how to begin developing relationships NOW with those legislators who helped Connecticut pass the strongest gun safety legislation in the county.
